

# A.A. IN EDUCATIONAL TEACHING STUDIES

The Educational Teaching Studies degree offers future school teachers an articulated transfer pathway and career ladder. The focus of the degree is on content knowledge needed to teach in an education setting and education courses that include early fieldwork opportunities for observation and practice. Coursework prepares students for the Multiple Subject CSET exam as required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing for elementary school teachers in both regular and special education. The degree is also appropriate for students pursuing a career other than in elementary school teaching such as tutors, teacher aides, and support staff related to careers in education.

1. Apply knowledge, skills, experience, and feedback to make an informed choice to be employed or to continue study in the field of education.
